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Dear Parents Issue: 03 October 6th 2023

Amalgamation Update:

- Scoil Chroí Naofa and Athenry Boys school are to amalgamate into one school with effect from September 2024.
- A new school is to be built on the site of the old Presentation college, once the Gael Scoileanna have moved into their new campus.
- In the meantime it is expected that the newly amalgamated Scoil Chroí Naofa and Athenry Boys school will operate out of the two existing school buildings until such time as the new building is complete.
- The Department of Education have appointed project managers (Rogerson Reddan) to oversee the design & delivery of a new school building. Their services will remain in situ a year after the build so that the snags etc. can all be ironed out before the keys are fully handed over.
- The project managers had a short meeting with both school principals (Mr Naughton & Mr Connolly) to introduce themselves. Also at the meeting were Malachy Molloy (patron representative), Rosaleen Crowe O'Neill (diocesan education secretary) and Philip Casey (Chairperson Board of Management Athenry Boys school). Apologies were received from Bernie Ryan (Chairperson Board of Management Scoil Chroí Naofa).
- At the meeting Mr David Flynn from Rogerson Reddan outlined the process. The new school build is a 3-step process and we are currently at step one:
 - o Step one: Procurement of a design team and school design completed
 - o Step two: Planning
 - Step three: Tenders for the build itself
- As I understand it, we can expect to have 24 classrooms, a full size basketball hall, ASD units, air to water and heat recovery for heating and ventilation respectively.
- A joint steering committee has been formed and they will have their first meeting this Monday Oct 9th.
- The steering committee is made up of 8 members from each school: Principal, Deputy Principal, two Board of Management members, two members of staff and two parent representatives.
- Scoil Chroí Naofa's 8 representatives are: Fergal Naughton, Cathríona Cronin, Bernie Ryan, Fergal Melia, Veronica Murray, Eithne Kennedy, Rachel Moore & Eiranne Heffernan.
- The impetus to amalgamate is now stronger than ever. I can definitely now say that Athenry will have an amalgamated school split between the boys campus and our own from September 2024.
- It's now a case of using our steering committee meetings well by bringing questions and suggestions etc. to these so that plans can be made to make the amalgamation as seamless as possible.
- The most important thing is that pupils, parents and staff are communicated well with and that we create a sense of anticipation and positivity about what lies ahead.
- This is all the information we have at this time. As soon as we have more details it will be shared.
