- Scoil Chroí Naofa is a Presentation Primary School. Tuesday November 21st was Presentation Day, our school feast day. We celebrated the day by going to mass in the church. We did this to commemorate the Venerable Nano Nagle (foundress of the Presentation Order) and her work.

Student Council:

Our new Student Council held their first meeting just before the mid-term break. All the representatives made great suggestions and all items were discussed with Mr Hanley, who explained that some of the suggestions were simply not possible but all the others would be considered and discussed with Mr Naughton and the other staff.

Vaccines for Junior & Senior Infants:

- A community medical doctor & a school public health nurse visited the school on Monday of this week to vaccinate the children in Junior Infants (whose parents had signed a consent form) with a 2nd dose of the MMR vaccine and the "4 in 1" vaccine.
- A community medical doctor & a school public health nurse visited the school on Wednesday of this week to administer a nasal flu vaccine to children in Senior Infants, whose parents had signed a consent form.

Accelerated Reading Programme:

• All pupils in classes from 2nd up to 6th class are participating in the accelerated reading programme. The girls seem to be really enjoying it and it is definitely fostering a love of reading among them all.

Science Week:

This week is science week and we have been celebrating science in the following ways over the past few weeks:

- All 14 classes in the school had a 1 hour *Lego workshop* with the wonderful facilitators from Bricks4Kidz. (*Sincere thanks to the parents council for funding this*).
- Ms Alani's 3rd class attended a workshop in Galway City Museum entitled *"Superhuman"*. This was an exciting exhibit full of hands-on fun and interactive elements which invited the pupils to explore the creativity and innovation of medtech research, seeking to find solutions for human illness. It was facilitated by Galway Science & Technology festival.
- Ms Tyrrell co-ordinated a *Science fair* in the hall today. A few pupils from each class demonstrated a science experiment to all the other classes in the school. Experiments covered Biology, Chemistry and Physics!! E.g. How the digestive system works, breathing & the lungs, Rainbow bridge, Lava lamps, the science of sound, magnets and many, many more! - Mr Kelly's class will be learning all about DNA by using the "*Fantastic DNA in a box*" kit we received from the Galway Science & Technology festival organisers.
- Different classes also linked in with *Science Foundation Ireland* who produced two jam-packed shows which were live streamed on You Tube. The theme of the shows were what it means to be human in today's world and how the decisions we make today will impact humans of the future.

Active School flag:

Scoil Chroí Naofa encourages our pupils to be active on a daily basis. With all the sporting & active options that the school takes part in, Mr Kelly is co-ordinating our application to renew our "Active School Flag". Between now and the Christmas holidays we are taking part in the following:

Parents Council:


- The *Cash4Clobber* collection held before the mid-term break raised €192 for the parents council.
- The first *Parents Council meeting* of this school year took place before the October mid-term break.
- Mr Kelly gave a very informative presentation about the use of *Smartphones* by primary school children. All parents present at the meeting agreed that the school should survey all parents to see if they would be willing to postpone the purchase of a smartphone for their primary school child until they move on to secondary school. - Each child in the school was given the opportunity to design their own *Christmas Card*. Parents were able to order packs of the Christmas cards on-line via the Design a Card portal. These orders should be delivered shortly. A number of parents missed the deadline for placing orders. Design a Card have temporarily re-opened the portal for very last minute orders. Smartphones:



In what class range is your eldest child in primary school?




Do any of your children attending primary school own a smartphone? 87 responses
